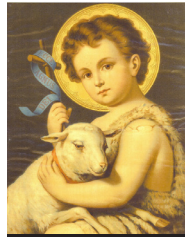

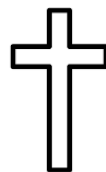

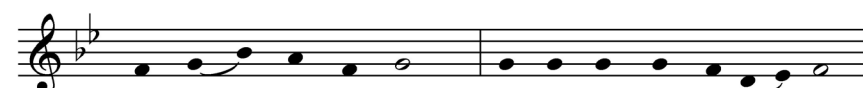

### Profession of Faith

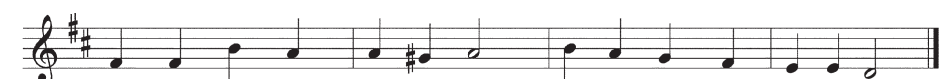

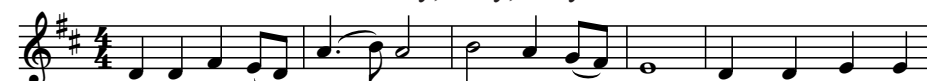
