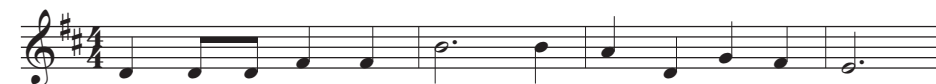

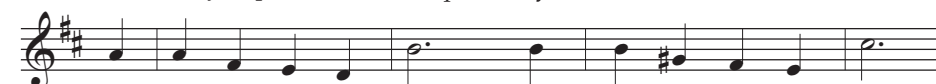

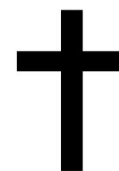

life of the world to come. Amen.**

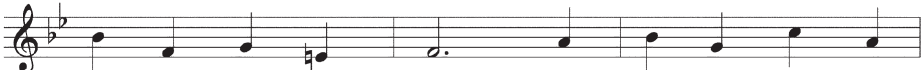
