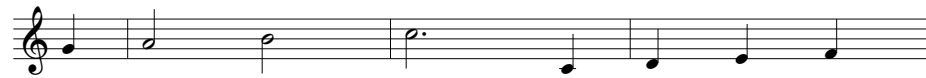

## Profession of Faith
