Lenten Schedule at the Cathedral

Adoration: Monday, 5-6p Feb. 22-Mar. 29

Stations of the Cross: Friday, 7p Feb. 19-Apr. 2

Confessions: Monday, 5-6p & Saturday, 3-3:30p; Feb. 20-Mar. 29

Holy Week

Palm Sunday: Mar. 28 - 4p Vigil & Mar. 29 - 10a Mass

Chrism Mass: Mar. 30 - 11a Mass (invitation only)

Holy Thursday: Apr. 1 - 7p Mass

Good Friday: Apr. 2 - 3p Mass

Holy Saturday: Apr. 3 - 8p Mass

Easter Sunday: Apr. 4 - 10a Mass; 9a Easter Concert

Lenten Regulations include fast and abstinence for those whose health permits.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting means to refrain from eating food between meals and to eat only one full meal with the other two being lighter meals. It is required of those who are 18-59 years old on the days noted above. Liquids are permitted between meals.

Abstinence means to refrain from eating meat. It is required of those 14 years of age and older on the days listed above.
