Prayer to St. Michael

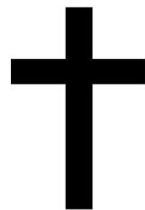

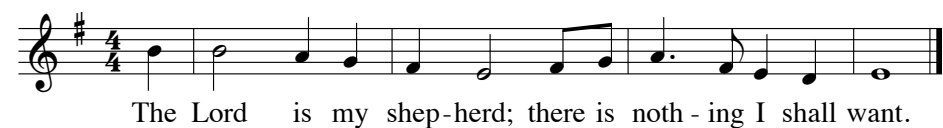

Mary, and became man.

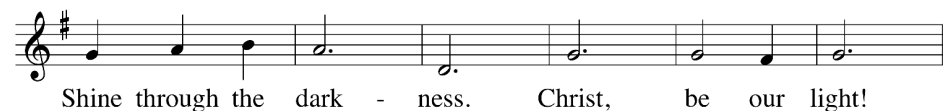
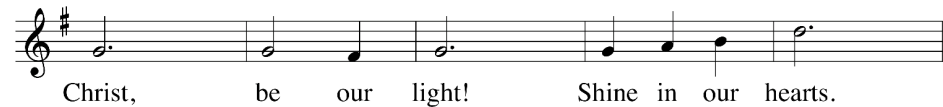
