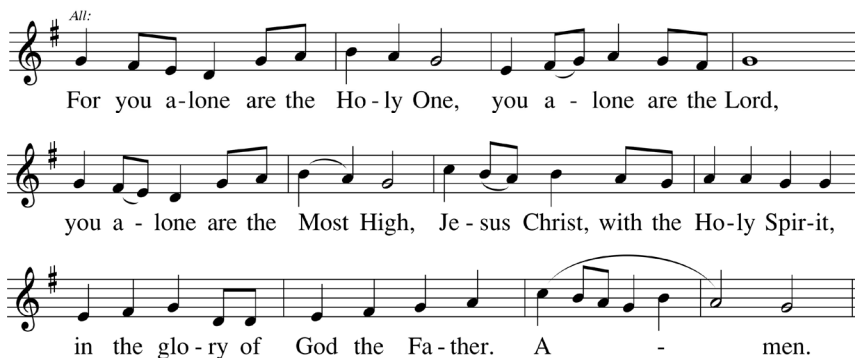

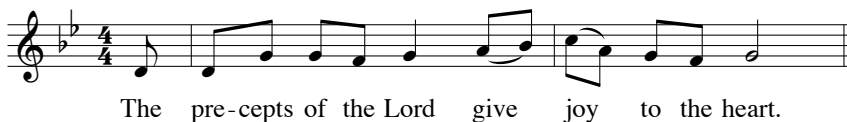

glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic
Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness
of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of
the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

POLISH: (*Beata Wolanski*) For the intentions that people wish to have remembered at this Mass (pause briefly). We pray to the Lord.


