Presentation of the Saint Gianna Beretta Molla Pro-Life Award

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was born in Magneta, Italy and became a pediatric specialist. She married Pietro Molla in 1955 and had three children. Saint Gianna was diagnosed with a uterine tumor when pregnant with her fourth child and chose to save the child, opting to remove the tumor rather than have an abortion. Seven days after giving birth, Saint Gianna Beretta Molla died from septic peritonitis.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was canonized in 2004 with her husband, siblings, children, and grandchildren present for the ceremony.

She was instrumental in the purchase of a permanent home for Carolyn's Place. For more than a decade, with the help of a dedicated team of volunteers, Ginny has organized the Carolyn's Place Annual Dinner and Silent Auction, a fundraising celebration for the Carolyn's Place pro-life mission. Ginny holds a Bachelor of Science in Education from SUNY Geneseo and a Master's Degree in Special Education from the University of Virginia. She taught special education in New York, Arizona, and Wisconsin before leaving to raise five children. She and her husband, Charlie, are members of Saint John the Evangelist Parish in Watertown. In addition to her work at Carolyn's Place, she spends most of her free time on "grandma duty" to her seven grandchildren, including 22-month-old quintuplets!
