





PROFESSION OF FAITH





Presentation of the Saint Gianna Beretta Molla Pro-Life Award

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was born in Magneta, Italy and became a pediatric specialist. She married Pietro Molla in 1955 and had three children. Saint Gianna was diagnosed with a uterine tumor when pregnant with her fourth child and chose to save the child, opting to remove the tumor rather than have an abortion. Seven days after giving birth, Saint Gianna Beretta Molla died from septic peritonitis.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was canonized in 2004 with her husband, siblings, children, and grandchildren present for the ceremony.


BLESSING AND DISMISSAL

Recipients of the Saint Gianna Beretta Molla Pro-Life Award

Deacon David Reynolds Founder and Board Chairman, Two Heats Pregnancy Care Center, Torrington

Deacon Reynolds is founder and Board Chairman of Two Hearts Pregnancy Care Center in Torrington. Two Hearts opened its doors in October 2012 to serve mothers and their children in Northwestern Connecticut. He currently serves as deacon at Our Lady of Hope Parish, which includes the Immaculate Heart of Mary Church (Harwinton) and Immaculate Conception Church (New Hartford). He also works as Associate Director of Public Policy for the Connecticut Catholic Conference, helping to promote the pro-life message in Connecticut.

Mrs. Lynn Reynolds Executive Director, Two Hearts Pregnancy Care Center, Torrington

Lynn Reynolds has been the Executive Director of Two Hearts Pregnancy Care Center since 2013. Lynn counsels clients seeking assistance from Two Hearts, coordinates a strong and dedicated volunteer staff, and has built significant relationships with numerous social service agencies in Torrington. Lynn's dedication has made Two Hearts a thriving prolife pregnancy care center.

James O'Boyle, from Mary Gate of Heaven Parish, Windsor Locks, has served in the respect life movement for more than 40 years serving with his Pro-Life Committee the needs of his parish. He worked to educate parishioners about all of the issues and concerns that come under the Respect Life Banner: the unborn, the elderly, the abandoned, and the poor. He also helped support pregnancy care centers. He made every effort to inform people about the terrible impact of the 1973 Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion.

Sister Patricia Glass, F.S.E., is a Franciscan Sister of the Eucharist who for the past 15 years has volunteered for the Pro-Life Office and accompanied the buses to the March for Life.
