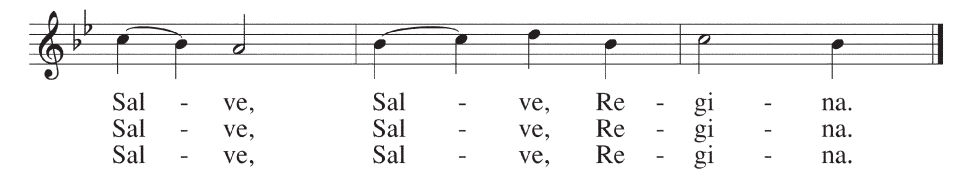
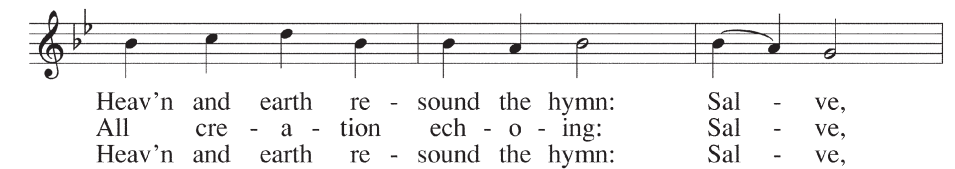
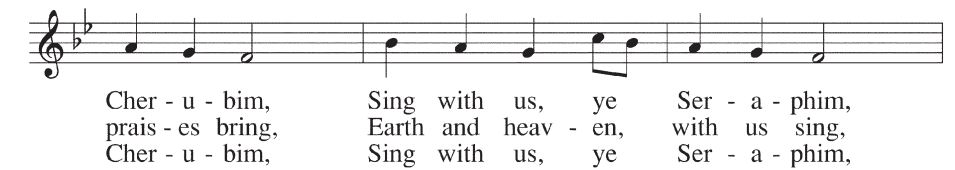
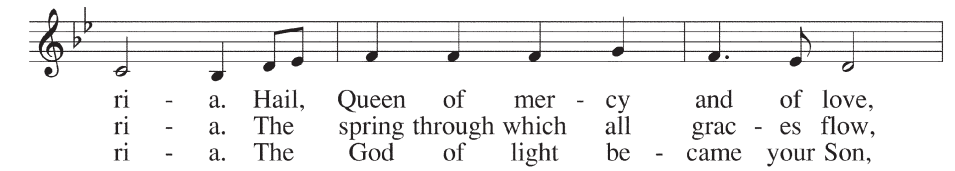
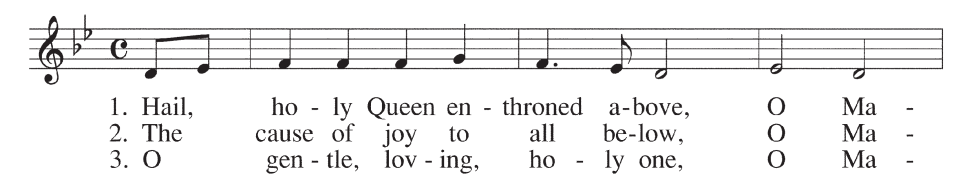
Blessing and Dismissal
